

voters of said town be and they are hereby authorized to cast a ballot "for the appointment of officers" or "against the appointment of officers," and if the majority of the votes cast be "for the appointment of officers," then sections 207 and 237, as by this act repealed and re-enacted, shall be in full force and effect, but if the majority of votes cast be "against the appointment of officers," then said sections 207 and 237 as herein repealed and re-enacted shall be of no effect and said sections shall remain in force as enacted by the act of 1890, chapter 201, and in that event the mayor and city council shall immediately order an election for bailiff and supervisor, to be held on the first Monday in May, eighteen hundred and ninety-two, and it shall be the duty of the city council to announce the result within three days thereafter.

SEC. 5. *And be it enacted*, That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 164.

AN ACT to add additional sections to article VII Code Public Local Laws, title "Carroll County," sub-title "Roads," to be designated sections 139, 140, 141, 142, 143 and 144.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That the following additional sections be added to article VII of the Code of Public Local Laws, title "Carroll County," sub-title "Roads," to be designated sections 139, 140, 141, 142, 143 and 144.

SEC. 139. The county commissioners of Carroll County shall, in the month of March, in each and every year after the passage of this act, appoint three road commissioners in each election district of the said county who shall be qualified voters and taxpayers in said election district, and who shall have been *bona fide* residents of the county for at least two years prior to the appointment, and of whom two shall be selected from the dominant political party in the county, and one from the minority party.

SEC. 140. Within twenty days after their appointment, or as soon thereafter as may be, the said road commissioners for each election district shall take the oath of office prescribed by the constitution before the clerk of the Circuit Court, and shall organize by electing one of their num-
