and the entire cost of the construction and maintenance of the roads, and bridges in any districts and a proportionate share of the joint bridges between said district, and adjoining districts under the provisions of this act, including the per diem of the road commissioners for said district, shall be paid out of the special tax levied on and collected in said district and no part thereof shall be paid by the County Commissioners out of the levy for county purposes; the Treasurer to make County Treasurer shall make the regular payments on payments. vouchers certified and approved by the road commissioners, or a majority of them for the respective districts and shall carefully preserve said vouchers and no payment shall be made without such certification and approval.

SEC. 144. Nothing in this act shall be construed to impair or abridge the general control over the property owned Control of by the county, and over county roads and bridges, now property. vested by law in the County Commissioners except as therein specifically provided, or their power to re-survey and mark and bound the public roads in said county and to lay out new roads, or the method of doing the same; and in case of disagreement in reference to the duties of said road commisssioners or appeal from any order or decision made by them, the County Commissioners shall be the judges of what is right and their decision shall be final.

SEC. 2. And be it enacted, That all acts or parts of acts inconsistent with the provisions of this act except chapter Repealed. 508 of the laws of 1890 be, and the same are hereby repealed, and that this act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

## CHAPTER 165.

AN ACT to add an additional section to article 4 of the Public Local Laws, title "City of Baltimore," to be known as section 806 A. Providing for the payment of money into court under condemnation proceedings in certain cases.
