

CHAPTER 169.

AN ACT to add an additional section to article ninety-three of the Code of Public General Laws, title "Testamentary Law," sub-title "Wills," to follow section 311, and to be known as section 311, A.

To add. SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That an additional section be added to article 93 of the Code of Public General Laws, title "Testamentary Law," sub-title "Wills," to follow section 311 and to be known as section 311 A.

Will or bequest SEC. 311 A. That nothing in sections 310, and 311 of this article shall effect or be applicable in anywise to any will or bequest executed prior to the first day of August, eighteen hundred and eighty-four.

Effective SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 170.

AN ACT to authorize and direct the sheriff, justices of the peace and other officers of Calvert County to pay over to the treasurer for said county all moneys for fines, &c.

Treasurer to receive moneys of Calvert County SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That all moneys, fines, penalties and forfeitures, collected by or coming into the hands of the sheriff, justices of the peace and other officers of Calvert County, and which are now paid or may hereafter be made payable to the county commissioners for the use of said county, shall by said sheriff, justices of the peace and other officers be paid to the treasurer for said county within thirty days after receiving same, to be used by said treasurer in liquidating any debts against the county, said sum to be accounted for by said treasurer in his reports to the county commissioners in the same manner, and at the same time as taxes are now accounted for, the said treasurer to receive three per cent. on all moneys thus paid over to him.

Misdemeanor. SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That any sheriff, justice of the peace or any other officers of Calvert County, refusing or neglecting to comply with the provisions of this act, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and subject to fine of not less than ten nor more than one hundred dollars or imprisonment at the discretion of the court.
