

## CHAPTER 185.

AN ACT to authorize and empower the Board of Police Commissioners for the city of Baltimore to purchase or lease ground in the 21st and 22nd wards of said city, or either of them, and to have erected thereon a suitable station house or station houses; to have the title thereof vested in the mayor and city council of Baltimore City, and to pay the cost and expenses thereof out of the special fund of the said Board of Police Commissioners.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the Board of Police Commissioners be, and they are hereby authorized and empowered to purchase or lease ground in the 21st and 22nd wards in the city of Baltimore, or either of them, as may be suitable in their judgment for the erection of a station house or houses thereon, and that they be and hereby are authorized and empowered to have erected thereon such station house or houses as they may deem suitable and proper. Station houses

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That the title to said lot of ground and the improvements thereon, shall be vested in the mayor and city council of Baltimore City. Title thereto.

SEC. 3. *And be it enacted,* That the purchase of said ground, and the cost of erection of said station house or station houses, shall be paid by the said Board of Police Commissioners out of their special fund. How paid for

SEC. 4. *And be it enacted,* That this act shall take effect from date of its passage. Effective

## CHAPTER 186.
