

Mortar, a tributary of said Middle River, lying north of a line drawn from Weir Point on James Hughes' shore to Weiskettle's landing;

And provided further, That it shall be unlawful for any person or persons to haul a seine or seines in that part or portion of Middle River described in this section at any time during the year under the same penalty as prescribed in section one of this act.

SEC. 4. And be it enacted, That this act shall take effect from date of its passage.

CHAPTER 203.

AN ACT to add a new section to article 17 of the Code of Public Local Laws, title "Prince George's County," sub-title "Roads," to follow immediately after section 278, to be designated as section 278 A, and to repeal and re-enact with amendments section 280 of said article under the same sub-title.

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That a new section to follow immediately after section 278 to be designated as section 278 A, of article 17 of the Code of Public Local Laws, title "Prince George's County," sub title "Roads," be and the same is hereby added to said article, and that section 280 of said article under the same sub-title be and the same is hereby repealed and re-enacted with amendments so as to read as to said respective sections as follows:

278 A. Whenever any road, now used as a private road, shall be opened to public travel by the County Commissioners, the owners of the lands through which such roads pass shall have time, not to exceed two years, within which to lane such roads and to remove the gates therefrom.

280. The County Commissioners of Prince George's County shall divide the county in road districts, not exceeding fourteen, for each of which they shall appoint one or more supervisors of skill and ability, who shall have charge of the repairs of all roads and bridges in their districts, except such bridges as the County Commissioners may deem it advisable to repair by contract. and said supervisor or supervisors shall give bond in such penalty and with such security as the County Commissioners may fix and approve, and with such conditions as they may prescribe in regard
