SEC. 3. *And be it further enacted*, That upon the payment of the said amount hereinbefore provided to be paid by said sureties to the treasurer of this State, the comptroller be and he is hereby authorized and directed to draw his warrant upon the treasurer in favor of said John P. Poe, for two thousand dollars, in full payment of his professional services as said special counsel of the State in all of said suits.

CHAPTER 208.

AN ACT to add an additional section to article 21 of the Code of Public Local Laws of this State, title "Talbot County," to be sub-titled "State's Attorney."

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That the following section be, and the same is hereby added to article 21 of the Code of Public Local Laws, title "Talbot County," under sub-title "State's Attorney" and to be known as section 237.

SEC. 237. *Be it enacted*, That the County Commissioners in addition to the appearance fees allowed by law to the State's Attorney, shall allow such State's Attorney such trial fees in cases, before the Circuit Court of said county and before justices of the peace of said county, as they may think just and proper, and shall make a levy for the same; provided however that the aggregate of such fees, appearance and trial, shall not exceed the sum of fifteen hundred dollars in any one year.
