SEC. 4. The members of the board appointed under this act shall not be entitled to any compensation for their ser- No comvices out of the State Treasury, except their expenses for pensation each day they are absent from their homes on the business

of said board.

SEC. 5. The Board of World's Fair Managers is authorized and directed to appoint an executive commissioner and Appointsuch other clerical assistants as, they may deem necessary and to fix their salaries subject to the approval of the Governor, which shall be payable monthly, out of the appropriation hereinafter made, and said executive commissioners shall be authorized and required to assume and exercise, subject to the supervision of said board all such execution powers and functions as may be necessary to secure a complete and creditable display of the interests of the State at the World's Columbian Exposition of 1893, and as the executive agent of said board he shall have personal charge of the solicitation, collection, transportation arrangement, and exhibition of the objects sent under the authority of the State to the World's Columbian Exposition of 1893, and to such objects sent by individual citizens of the State as may be by them, placed in his charge. He shall make a report to the board monthly and at such other times as the board may request, and shall hold office at the pleasure of the board.

SEC. 6. The said board shall have charge of the interest of the State and its citizens in the preparation and exhibition at the World's Columbian Exposition of 1893, of the natural and industrial products of the State, and of objects illustrating its history, progress, moral and material welfare and future development, and in all other matters relating to the said World's Columbian Exposition; it shall communicate with the officers of and obtain and disseminate through the State all necessary information regarding said exposition and in general have and exercise full authority in relation to the participation of the State of Maryland and its citizens in the World's Columbian Exposition of 1893.

SEC. 7. The said board shall make a report of its proceedings and expenditures from time to time to the Governor, and at any time upon his written request to be by him transmitted to the legislature, together with such sug-
