within three days thereafter, make a written return of such vote to the clerk of the Circuit Court for Frederick County, and said clerk shall record said returns among the records of his office, and if it shall appear that a majority of votes cast shall have been against the sale of spirituous or fer- the sale. mented liquors, then the clerk of said court shall prepare a certificate proclaiming the result for such election in said district and cause said certificate to be published once in one newspaper published in said county, and the polls shall be kept open at said election from eight o'clock a. m. until six o'clock p. m.

SEC. 2. And be it enacted, That if it shall appear by the return of said judges of election, and certificate of the clerk of said court, that a majority of the votes cast in the said to sell district shall be against the sale of spirituous or fermented liquors, then it shall not be lawful for any person or persons, or body corporate, to sell directly or indirectly at any place, or to give away at his, her or their place of business any spirituous or fermented liquors, or intoxicating drinks of any kind, nor shall it be lawful for the clerk of the Circuit Court for Frederick County to issue a license for the sale of spirituous or fermented liquors in said district, on or after the first day of May in the year eighten hundred and ninety-three.

SEC. 3. And be it enacted, That if any person or persons or body corporate, shall sell directly or indirectly at Shall sell any place, or give away at his, her or their place of busi-or give ness, any spirituous or fermented liquors or intoxicating drinks of any kind, on or after the first day of May in the year eighteen hundred and ninety-three (should the majority of the votes cast at said election be against the sale of spirituous or fermented liquors), he, she or they shall, on conviction thereof in the Circuit Court for said county, be fined not less than fifty dollars nor more than three hundred dollars.

SEC. 4. And be it enacted, That the county commissioners of said Frederick County, shall appoint three judges of election and two clerks, residents of said district, for said judges of special election, each of whom shall qualify by taking the following oaths respectively: I, A. B., do swear (or affirm) that I will permit all persons to vote, who shall offer to vote at the special election now to be held for Mt. Pleasant district, in Frederick County, whose names shall appear on the list of the voters furnished to me as required by law, as qualified voters under the constitution and laws of this State, and that I will not permit any person to vote at the said election, whose name shall not be found upon the said
