30. That the treasurer is authorized on the order of the Board of Public Works to obtain duplicate certificates for any bank stock owned and held by the State, when the original certificates have been lost or misplaced; and when any duplicate certificates have heretofore been issued to said treasurer on his application in pursuance to an order of said board or may hereafter be issued to him in pursuance to the order of said board, the State does hereby agree and undertake to indemnify and save harmless and free from loss the said banks so issuing or having issued said duplicate certificates as aforesaid. Bank stock owned and held by State.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted*, That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage. Effective

CHAPTER 229.

AN ACT to appropriate a sum of money to assist in defraying the expenses incurred in erecting a monument on the battle ground of Antietam in this State, to the soldiers of the Fifth Regiment, Maryland Volunteers who fell in that battle, and to mark the site where the regiment fought.

WHEREAS, the survivors of the Fifth Regiment of Maryland Volunteers have caused to be erected upon the battle fields of Antietam, a monument to mark the place occupied by that gallant regiment in that sanguinary battle, and in memory of the members of that regiment who there fell in defense of the Union, and Preamble.

WHEREAS, the cost of erecting the said monument amounted to the sum of nine hundred and forty dollars, of which sum there still remains due and unpaid the sum of five hundred and thirty dollars, therefore, Preamble.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That the sum of five hundred and thirty dollars, be and the same is hereby appropriated to assist in defraying the expenses incurred in erecting a monument on the battle ground of Antietam to the soldiers of the Fifth Regiment of Maryland Volunteers who fell in that battle and to mark the site where that regiment fought. SEC. 2. *And be it enacted*, That the money appropriated by this act shall be paid over by the State Treasurer to Colonel
