said limits. And they shall have the right to lay a tax not exceeding in any one year thirty cents on the one hundred dollars on the taxable property within said corporation limits, to be applied to carrying out the purposes of said corporation. They shall be entitled to appoint, as soon as may be convenient, after each regular election a town bailiff, who shall hold till the next election, unless sooner removed by the commissioners, and if a vacancy occurs in the office of town bailiff, they may fill the same.

331. The town bailiff shall act as collector of the taxes imposed by the commissioners and shall pay the same over Beiliffto the commissioners, or under their direction. He shall duties of. also act as a peace officer within the corporate limits, and shall possess within the same all the criminal powers belonging to the office of constable. As collector of taxes, the town bailiff shall be authorized to enforce payment of such taxes in the same manner and to the extent, as the collectors of State and county taxes, or the same may be collected as small debts in an action before any justice of the peace of said county, in the name of the town commissioners, and the summons in any such action may be served by the sheriff of said county or by the town bailiff wherever he may find the persons whose property is liable for such taxes, and all such taxes shall become a lien on the real estate of the persons owing the same, lying within the limits of said corporation, from the date of the levy thereof. Judgments recovered for such taxes when recorded in the office of the clerk of the Circuit Court of said county, may be enforced against real estate as in the case of other judgments before justices of the peace, and they may be enforced against personality as in the case of like judgment under execution directed to the sheriff or any constable.

332. The violations of any ordinance of the said corpora-Fines and tion shall be a misdemeanor, and the person guilty of such forfeitures. violations may be tried and punished, as in the case of other misdemeanors. All fines and forfeitures imposed for the violation of such ordinances shall be paid over to the town commissioners for the use of said town.

333. The said commissioners shall have full power to lay streets, out new streets or roads within said corporate limits, and to straighten, widen or change existing roads, streets or highways, and they shall be authorized to do all things necessary to keep such streets, roads or highways within such corporate limits in good condition, and free from obstruction, and they may pass ordinances regulating such roads, high ways or streets and imposing fines and forfeitures for obstructing the same.
