- SEC. 2. And be it enacted, That the exemption under Limit of exemption. this act shall not extend to any member, who now or may hereafter hold any military commission or who shall be a member of the National Guard of this State.
- SEC. 3. And be it enacted, That no part of the appropriation for the support of the militia of the State shall be receive used for the said veteran corps, except when in active ser-appropriation. vice in cases of invasion or insurrection.
- SEC. 4. And be it enacted, That the officers of the veteran corps shall be elected in accordance with the constitu- omcers of tion and by-laws adopted by said corps, and shall be subject to the approval of the commander-in-chief of the Maryland National Guard and be commissioned by him. A report shall be filed annually with the Adjutant-General of the State as to the general condition of the corps.

SEC. 5. And be it enacted, That this act shall take effect Effective. from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 316.

AN ACT to repeal the first and third sections of the article of incorporation of the Hillsborough Methodist Episcopal Church South and to re-enact the first section with amendments.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That section first and third of the articles of Amendincorporation of the Hillsborough Methodist Episcopal Church South, in Caroline County State of Maryland, incorporated under the General Incorporation Laws of Maryland, be, and the same are hereby repealed and the first section be and is hereby re-enacted so as to read as follows:

FIRST, The trustees shall be responsible to the quarterly conference which shall have power to dismiss them from frustees office in accordance with the provisions of the book of dis-conference. cipline of the Methodist Episcopal Church, South; and in case of vacancies by death, resignation, removal, legal incapacity or any other cause, the said vacancies shall be vacancies filled by nomination of the preacher in charge, or in his absence, by the presiding elder, subject to the confirmation or rejection of the quarterly conference.

SEC. 2. And be it enacted, That this act shall take effect Effective. from the date of its passage.
