

months next preceding said election, as Commissioners of Walkersville, to serve for one year, or until their successors shall be elected and qualified; they shall receive no pay for their services.

**President.** SEC. 4. *Be it enacted,* That the commissioners shall, at their first meeting after an election, elect one of their number to be president of the board, and all vacancies in the board of commissioners shall be filled by an election held, after ten days' notice given by the remaining commissioners.

**Meetings.** SEC. 5. *Be it enacted,* That the said commissioners shall meet in said town on or before the first Monday in June succeeding their election, and from time to time as occasion may require.

**Appoint clerk.** SEC. 6. *Be it enacted,* That the commissioners shall annually appoint a clerk, who shall keep the minutes of the proceedings in a well-bound book, which shall be open to the inspection of all persons interested therein, and shall perform such duties as the commissioners may assign him.

**Appoint judges of election.** SEC. 7. *Be it enacted,* That the commissioners shall annually, on or before the first Monday in April, appoint three judges of election, who shall conduct the election, and receive the ballots of all male citizens of said town of the age of twenty-one and upwards, who shall have resided in said town six months next preceding the election; that the polls shall be opened at three o'clock p. m.; and closed at seven o'clock p. m.; that the first election held under the provisions of this act, shall be on the first Monday of May, in the year eighteen hundred and ninety-two, and that George P. Rinehart, John L. McMaster and Charles O. Bitler or any two of them, who shall serve as such are hereby appointed judges for that purpose; and said judges shall determine all questions arising under said election, and a certificate of election of said commissioners under the hands and seals of said judges, or any two of them, shall be sufficient authority for them to act as such.

**To receive election returns** SEC. 8. *Be it enacted,* That the commissioners shall receive all returns of election, and determine all questions arising thereon.

**Bailiff.** SEC. 9. *Be it enacted,* That the commissioners may appoint, annually, a bailiff for said town, who shall perform such duties as may be required of him by said commissioners, and preserve peace and good order in said town, and for that purpose he shall have all the powers of a county constable.

SEC. 10. *Be it enacted,* That the commissioners and all other officers of the corporation shall, before they enter
