

upon the duties of their office, make oath that they will diligently and faithfully, to the best of their skill and judgment, perform the duties of their office, and shall file a certificate thereof, signed by the officer before whom said oath was made, among the records of the corporation. Oath.

SEC. 11. *Be it enacted*, That the commissioners may pass such ordinances not inconsistent with law as they may deem beneficial to the town; may widen, grade and pave streets; may repair and lay sidewalks; may impose a tax upon dogs and other animals running at large, remove nuisances and obstructions therefrom, restrain all disorders and disturbances, prevent all congregations of disorderly persons in public places, and impose fines, penalties and forfeitures for the violation of their ordinances; and may commit all offenders to the county jail until the same be paid with costs. Pass ordinances.

SEC. 12. *And be it enacted*, That any fines, penalties and forfeitures imposed by this charter or by any ordinance of the commissioners may be collected by proceedings in the name of the commissioners before a justice of the peace and the justice of the peace shall have power to commit the offender to the county jail, on failure to pay such fines and forfeitures, until the same shall be paid with costs. Fines, Penalties, &c.

SEC. 13. *Be it enacted*, That the commissioners may, whenever they think the public interest requires it, cause an assessment to be made of all real property within the corporate limits of said town, subject to the assessment for county and State taxes, and they may prescribe the manner in which such assessment shall be made, and provide for adjusting all differences in violation to such assessment, and do all other things necessary in making such assessment; providing such assessment shall not exceed the assessment for State and county purposes; and the commissioners may levy a tax on the assessable real property, within the corporate limits of said town, not exceeding in any one year ten (10) cents in the one hundred dollars worth of assessable property. May cause an assessment.

SEC. 14. *Be it enacted*, That any person may appeal from the valuation made by the assessor to the commissioners at their next regular meeting, and such commissioners shall remain in session as long as may be reasonable to hear and determine such appeals, and shall give reasonable notice of such meeting, and may abate or increase the assessment as may seem just. Proviso.

SEC. 15. *Be it enacted*, That whenever the commissioners shall levy a tax they shall cause to be made out an alphabetical list of the persons to be charged therewith, and shall Appeal from valuation.
