

Frederick turnpike to the Bigg's Ford road, known as Fulton avenue and Maple avenue; the street running from G. S. Bishop's shop to the Pennsylvania railroad by way of Dr. Charles W. Goldsborough's house, and the street running from the Bigg's Ford road at Charles N. Seachrist's house by way of Lewis P. Ramsburg's house within the corporate limits of said town are hereby made and declared to be public streets or avenues of said town, and shall be from time to time improved and repaired as in the discretion of the commissioners, the public interest may require and the resources of the town will justify; but this section shall not be considered as interfering in any manner with the rights of the Woodsborough and Frederick Turnpike Company in maintaining their road through said town; provided, however, that the commissioners may lay sidewalks along said turnpike road in such manner as not to impede or obstruct the proper use thereof by said company.

SEC. 24. *And be it enacted*, That neglect or non-use shall not work a forfeiture of this charter. Neglect or non-use.

SEC. 7. *And be it enacted*, That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage. Effective.

CHAPTER 352.

AN ACT to prohibit riding and driving in an immoderate speed or gait over the bridges in Anne Arundel County.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That it shall not be lawful for any person to run, gallop or drive in an immoderate speed or gait any horses, mare, gelding or beast, on or over any of the public bridges in Anne Arundel County, and such person or persons shall put such horse, mare, gelding or beast, in a walk when passing over the draws in said bridges; and any person so offending shall be fined not less than five dollars, nor more than ten dollars, one-half thereof to be paid to the informer, and the other half to the county commissioners of said county for the use of the county. Fast driving over public bridges in Anne Arundel County.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted*, That the county commissioners for said county shall cause the provisions of this act to be posted on each of the public bridges of said county, and any person defacing or destroying such posters, or notices, shall be subject to the punishment now imposed by law on persons destroying or defacing property. Post provisions of this act.
