## CHAPTER 365.

AN ACT to repeal sections one and two of chapter four hundred and ninety, passed at the January session of the General Assembly of Maryland, for the year eighteen hundred and ninety, entitled an act to add additional sections to article thirteen of the Code of Public Local Laws of this State, title "Harford County," sub-title "Wild Fowl," to be designated sections three hundred and sixteen, three hundred and seventeen and three hundred and eighteen.

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That sections one and two of chapter four hundred and ninety, passed at the January session of the General Assembly of Maryland, for the year eighteen hundred and ninety, entitled an act to add additional section to article thirteen of the Code of Public Local Laws of this State, title "Harford County," sub-title "Wild Fowl," to be designated sections three hundred and sixteen, three hundred and seventeen and three hundred and eighteen, be and the same are hereby repealed.

SEC. 2. And be it enacted, That this act shall take effect Effective. from the date of its passage.

## CHAPTER 366.

AN ACT to provide for the number and terms of the County Commissioners of Washington County by virtue of article 7, section 1, of the constitution of Maryland, as amended.

SECTION 1.
