Local Laws, title "Montgomery County," sub-title "Birds and Game," be and the same is hereby repealed and reenacted so as to read as follows:

55. No person shall trap, shoot or in any manner catch, kill or take, any partridge in Montgomery County between Limit of the fifteenth day of December and the first day of November; tame for nor any woodcock between the first day of January and the killing partridges, first day of July; nor any pheasant between the first day of January and the first day of September; nor any woodcock between the first day of January and the first day of September: nor any wild turkey between the first day of February and the first day of November; nor any rabbit between the first day of February and the first day of September; nor any gray squirrel between the fifteenth day of December and the first day of August.

SEC. 2. And be it enacted. That this act shall take effect Effective. from the date of its passage.

Approved April 4th, 1892.

CHAPTER 371.

AN ACT to refund to William S. Gordy late collector of taxes for Wicomico County, a certain sum of money erroneously paid by him into the treasury.

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly-of Maryland, That the comptroller of the treasurer be and he is hereby authorized and directed to draw his warrant upon Appropriation, the treasurer in favor of William S. Gordy late collector of taxes for the fourth election district of Wicomico County, in the sum of fifty-two dollars and eighty-five cents said amount being overpaid by him into the treasury for the year 1885, the treasury officials having recommended the refunding thereof.

SEC. 2. And be it enacted, That this act shall take effect Effective. from the date of its passage.
