persons to be found drunk or acting in a riotous or dis-Drunkenessorderly manner to the disturbance of the peace of any in Liberty citizen or citizens within the village of Liberty, or within one mile of the Methodist Protestant Church, in said village in Frederick County Maryland, and any person or persons who shall be convicted thereof before any justice of the peace of the said district, shall be fined not less than one dollar nor more than five dollars, and the cost of prosecution, and in default of the payment of said fine and costs shall be committed to the jail of said county and confined therein for the period of not less than ten days, nor more than twenty days, provided, that any person or persons so convicted shall have the right of appeal to the Circuit Court for said county upon giving bond in a sum to be fixed by said justice, sufficient to secure the payment of said fine and costs, and the probable costs in said court, conditioned that if the party appealing shall not prosecute his appeal with effect at the next term of the Circuit Court for said county, and also pay and satisfy said fine and costs and the costs in said court in case the judgment shall be affirmed, then the said bond to be and remain in full force and virtue, otherwise to be of no effect.

Fines. SEC. 2. And be it enacted, That all fines and penalties imposed and collected under this act, shall be paid to the board of county commissioners of said county for the use of said county.

Repeal SEC. 3. And be it enacted, That all acts or parts of acts inconsistent with this act be and the same are hereby repealed.

SEC. 4. And be it enacted, That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

Heath each the sum of fifty dollars for illegal fines paid by them respectively for alleged violation of the local oyster law of Somerset County, in the State of Maryland.
