SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the Comptroller of the Treasury of the State of Maryland, be and he is hereby authorized and directed to draw his warrant upon the Treasurer of the State of Maryland, in favor of the said Eugene E. Grannan, for the sum of eighty-five dollars and fifteen cents (\$85.15), as compensation to him for services rendered as agent as aforesaid. To pay Eugene E. Grannan

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage. Effective.

#### CHAPTER 416.

AN ACT to repeal section two hundred and thirty-six of article seven of the Code of Public Local Laws of the State of Maryland, relating to the city of Westminster, in Carroll County, as amended by section two hundred and thirty-six, chapter two hundred and ninety two, of the acts of 1890, and to re-enact the same in an amended form.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That section two hundred and thirty-six of article seven of the Code of Public Local Laws of the State of Maryland, relating to the city of Westminster, in Carroll County, as amended by section two hundred and thirty-six, chapter two hundred and ninety-two of the acts of 1890, be, and the same is hereby repealed and re-enacted so as to read as follows: Repealed and re-enacted.

236. The mayor or common council of Westminster, shall have full power and authority to regulate and provide for the issuing of licenses or permits for all hawking, peddling and vending of goods, wares and merchandise of every description upon the streets, lanes, alleys or highways of the city of Westminster, and to issue licenses or permits to all itinerant peddlers who may go from house to house to vend or sell any goods, wares or merchandise, to issue licenses to any and all persons entering into or beginning any transient business in said city, for the sale of any goods, wares or merchandise; to impose a license upon all fire insurance companies and agencies located in or doing business in said To regulate the issuing of licenses in Westminster.
