to regulate fire companies; to provide for the safety of houses, buildings and chimneys from fire; to prevent the discharge of cannon, guns, pistols, fire-crackers or other explosive instruments or materials in the corporate limits; to require a license to keep dogs and bitches and to regulate their running at large; to prevent and regulate the going at large of beasts, cattle, sheep and hogs; to restrain or regulate public amusements, entertainments or exhibitions, and to license the same; to restrain disorders and disturbances and immoralities to make, repair or keep in order the roads, streets, lanes, footways and alleys of said town, and the drains, sewers and culverts thereof, and to build or secure a place of confinement for persons charged or convicted of violating the laws and ordinances for the suppression of vice and immorality, and disorders.

SEC. 13. And be it enacted, That they shall cause to be made an assessment from time to time of all property, real and personal within the limits of said town, and shall annually levy a tax upon all such property, not to exceed in any one year twenty-five cents on the one hundred dollars, as they may deem necessary for their corporate expenses.

SEC. 14. And be it enacted, That they may by ordinances, direct what material shall be used in the paving, repairing and curbing the footways, or any of them, in said town, and provide that the same shall be done at the expense of the owners of the land in front of which said footway shall be made or repaired.

SEC. 15. And be it enacted, That if the owner of any land shall refuse or neglect for thirty days after notice, to Paving to pave, curb or repair any footway immediately in front of be done at his land on the same side of the road, street, lane or alley owner therewith, as directed by any ordinance of the council consistent, with this sub-title, the mayor shall cause said work to be done at the expense of the owner of said lot, which expense shall be a lien on said lot of ground until paid, and may be recovered from the owner or owners of such lot of ground by the mayor and council of Hampstead, as other debts of like amounts are recovered in this State by law.

SEC. 16. And be it enacted, That in opening, establishing, widening or closing any roads, streets, lanes or alleys, all damages done or suffered thereby, if not agreed upon by opening streets the mayor and council and the person damaged, shall be determined and assessed by three disinterested persons of good judgment, residents of said town, to be appointed by said mayor and council, and who shall make an oath before
