

SEC. 2. *And be it further enacted,* That said Register of Wills for Washington County be required to transcribe wills, books Liber "B" and "C," in said office in well-bound books suitable and proper for the purpose.

Transcribe records of wills.

SEC. 3. *And be it enacted,* That the said Register of Wills shall receive for such service compensation at the rate now allowed by law for recording.

Compensation

SEC. 4. *Be it enacted,* That the county commissioners of said county are hereby authorized and required to levy such sum as be necessary to pay for said service, and for the costs of the books used for said purpose, upon the certificate of the judges of the Orphans' Court of said county showing the amount and setting forth that said work has been satisfactorily performed.

CHAPTER 423.

AN ACT to regulate the sale and the granting of license for the sale of spirituous and fermented liquors in Carroll County.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That no person shall hereafter sell, offer for sale or keep for sale, in Carroll County any intoxicating liquors of any kind without having previously obtained a license therefor as hereinafter provided, but this act shall not apply to sales made by any person under a provision of law requiring him to sell personal property or for sales of cider or native wines by the makers thereof and not to be drank on the premises.

Licenses.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That all licenses to sell spirituous and fermented liquors shall expire on the first day of May next ensuing the date of their issue, and shall be issued for twelve, nine, six, or three months, and for no other times.

When to expire.

SEC. 3. *And be it enacted,* That any person desiring to obtain a license to sell spirituous or fermented liquors in Carroll County, except as hereinafter otherwise provided, shall on or before the first day of April, if he desire a license for twelve months, on or before the first day of July, if he desire a license for nine months, on or before the first
