for expenses incurred by the attendance, etc., at the Circuit Court for Charles County, etc., which will become due and demandable in April eighteen hundred and ninety-two.

SEC. 5. And be it further enacted, That the county commissioners shall in each and every year levy upon the Levy to assessable property in Charles County such a sum of money interest. as may be necessary to pay the interest on the outstanding bonds as therein issued in pursuance of this act, as shall fall due and also such further and additional sums as may be required to gradually retire and reduce such bonds until they shall have been reduced and said taxes authorized by this act shall be collected as other taxes are collected in said county.

SEC. 5. And be it further enacted, That this act shall take Effective. effect from the date of its passage.

## CHAPTER 430.

AN ACT to declare the sanction and consen tof the General Assembly of Maryland, to sundry gifts, bequests and devises contained in the last wills and testaments of certain persons, late of the State of Maryland, deceased. and also to certain gifts, grants, sales, leases and deeds made by various persons in this State to and for the use and benefit of sundry ministerial persons, religious corporations, denominations or sects and to certain charitable institutions hereafter nan ed.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the sanction and consent of the Generalsanction to Assembly of Maryland, be, and the same are hereby declared, sundry begiven and granted to the following gifts, bequests, devises, grants, sales, leases and deeds to and for the use of certain ministerial persons, religious corporations, denominations or sects and to certain charitable institutions as herein set forth.

First. To the several gifts, devises and bequests of James Walsh, late of Harford County, deceased, by his last will and testament, admitted to probate and now of record in the office of the Register of Wills of said county, to the Right Reverend C. P. Maes, Bishop of the Diocese of Covington, Kentucky, or his successor, in trust; to the Saint Peter's Benevolent Society in Cincinnati, in trust; to Saint
