Improvement bonds,

be and they are hereby authorized and empowered to issue bonds of said council of Brunswick to be designated as improvement bonds, not exceeding the sum of twenty thousand dollars, in the aggregate in sums of not less than fitty dollars each, in four series, to be signed by the mayor of said town and countersigned by the clerk thereof and sealed with the corporate seal; said bonds to bear interest payable semi-annually on the first day of June, and on the first day of December in each and every year, at a rate of interest not exceeding the sum of six per centum, per annum, for which interest proper coupons shall be attached to said bonds, signed and countersigned as aforesaid.

SEC. 2. And he it enacted, That said bonds shall be when issued, payable twenty-five years from the date thereof; payable, and redeemable at any time after the expiration of ten years from the date, at the pleasure of said council of Brunswick; and shall be exempt from all county and municipal taxation.

SEC. 3. And be it enacted, That the council of Brunswick shall provide annually out of the annual tax levy an Payment annual amount sufficient to pay the interest on said bonds and they shall set apart the further sum of two hundred dollars for each series issued to be invested in such securities as they may select to create a sinking fund for the redemption of said bonds, upon their maturity.

SEC. 4. Provided that the question of issuing these Dependent bonds be submitted to the people of Brunswick at the next on vote of people. The people of Brunswick at the next and common council, to be held in August, 1892, and that no contracts under this act be entered into until the issuing cf said bonds shall be ratified by the people.

SEC. 5. And be it enacted, That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage.
