and at such times as the president and directors shall prescribe and require, and if any subscriber shall neglect to pay any installment for the space of thirty days after the same shall be due and payable, the stock on which it is due and demanded shall, at the discretion of said president and directors, be forfeited to the corporation; provided, nevertheless, that nothing herein contained shall be construed to prevent said corporation from suing for and recovering such unpaid installments in like manner as other debts and claims are recoverable; and said company shall commence operations within two years from the passage of this bill.

SEC. 9. And be it enacted. That this act shall take effect Effecave from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 452.

AN ACT to carry into effect section one of article seven of the Constitution of this State, so far as the same relates to Howard County, and to repeal section thirty-nine of article fourteen of the Public Local Laws, title "Howard County," sub-title "County Commissioners and County Collectors" and to re-enact the same with amendments.

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That section thirty-nine of article fourteen of the Repealed Public Local Laws, title "Howard County," sub-title and County Commissioners and County Collectors," be and the same is hereby repealed and re-enacted so as to read as follows:

SEC. 39. There shall be three "County Commissioners" for Howard County; one of the three commissioners elected county to office on Tuesday next after the first Monday in the month somers for of November eighteen hundred and ninety-one, one to wit; Howard County Henry Mollman shall hold office for the space of two years; and one to wit; L. I. Gillis Owings shall hold office for the space of four years; and one to wit; Benjamin F. Hess shall hold office for the space of six years; and at all elections hereafter to be held for the office of County Commissioners for Howard County, the person elected shall hold office for a term of six years, so that there shall be an election for one county commissioner every two years.

SEC. 2. And be it enacted, That this act shall take effect Effective from the date of its passage.
