

Repealed and re-enacted. 'ninety-three of the Code of Public General Laws of Maryland, title "Testamentary Law," sub-title "Orphans' Court," be and the same is hereby repealed and re-enacted, so as to read as follows :

Salary of Judges of Orphans' Court, Baltimore. 227. The judges of the Orphans' Court of the several counties shall each receive the sum of four dollars, and the judges of the Orphans' Court of Baltimore City, shall receive six dollars for every day's attendance upon the sessions of said court, to be paid by the counties and the city of Baltimore respectively, provided, that in Allegany and St. Mary's Counties said judges shall not lose said per diem, if prevented from attending the session of said court by reason of an actual, *bona fide* sickness such as renders them unable to attend to the ordinary pursuits of life.

Effective. SEC. 2. *And be it enacted*, That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 467.

AN ACT to amend the charter of the Central Railway Company.

Preamble. WHEREAS, the Central Railway Company, a corporation incorporated under the act of eighteen hundred and seventy-six, chapter two hundred and forty-two, has duly become vested with certain rights, franchises and privileges heretofore granted to it by ordinances of the mayor and city council of Baltimore.

Preamble. AND WHEREAS, said company is about to rebuild, extend and equip its road, and it is deemed advisable that it should borrow money for the purpose, and issue bonds and pledge its property and franchises to secure the payment of the same therefore,

Central Railway Company. SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That said railway company shall have and exercise all the rights, franchises and privileges heretofore, or which may hereafter be, granted to it by the mayor and city council of Baltimore, and shall have the right to construct and operate its road through and on any of the streets of the city of Baltimore for which it has been or may hereafter be granted the privilege by ordinance or ordinances of the mayor and city council of Baltimore, and subject to such terms and conditions as may be imposed and declared in such ordinance or ordinances.
