and such road so declared to be a public highway, shall be kept in good order and repair by the road supervisor of the district in which such road is situated, as other public roads are.

SEC. 199. And be it enacted, That whenever any doubt exists as to the proper location or width of a road, the supervisor of the district, under the direction of the County Cause to Commissioners, may cause the same to be surveyed and make surveyed. such alterations as the public convenience may require subject as to the rights of any person to the provisions contained in the general laws for the opening of new roads.

SEC. 200. And be it enacted, That where there shall not be sufficient money in the county treasury, set apart as a general road and bridge fund, to meet the requirements of Author-the county at large, the County Commissioners are hereby ized to authorized to borrow upon the credit of the county a sum not exceeding twenty thousand dollars therefor, and shall pay the same together with the interest out of the general road and bridge fund, and said fund shall be used for no other purpose.

SEC. 201. And be it enacted, That sections eighty-three to ninety-nine inclusive, and sections nineteen to thirty-four Inforce. inclusive, of article twenty-four of the Code of Public General Laws on the subject of bridges and opening, altering and closing public roads, be and the same are hereby declared to be in force in Baltimore County.

SEC. 2. And be it enacted, That this act shall take effect Effective from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 51.

AN ACT to appropriate a sum of money to pay A. S. Abell & Co. and others for publishing the Constitutional amendments and Governor's proclamation, according to contract made with the Governor of the State of Maryland.

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Comptroller of the State be and he is hereby authorized and directed to issue his warrant, upon to pay for the treasurer of the State, for eight hundred and seventy nine dollars and ninety cents in favor of A. S. Abell & Co., on titue of the Baltimore Sun; for six hundred and thirty seven dollars and fifty cents in favor of Chas. C. Fulton & Co., of ments.
