

required to collect all license fees under same act, and to pay over a certain portion thereof to the State of Maryland; and

WHEREAS, Louis H. Rehn as such collector and treasurer has for the years 1890 and 1891 collected and paid over to the said State on account of said "License Fees" the sum of \$2,455.25; and Preamble.

WHEREAS, there is no provision in said act for an allowance to the collector and treasurer of said city to retain a commission on said sum of money for collecting the same; therefore, Preamble.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That the comptroller of this State be and he is hereby authorized and directed to draw his warrant upon the treasurer of this State in favor of Louis H. Rehn for the sum of one hundred and twenty-two dollars and seventy-five cents (\$122.75), which sum is hereby appropriated for that purpose. To pay

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted*, That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage. Effective.

Taylor, William Deale and G. W. Ryan for money due for services rendered in State tobacco warehouses number one and number two.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That the Treasurer of the State of Maryland upon the warrant of the Comptroller of the treasury, who is hereby authorized and directed to issue the same, be and he is hereby directed to pay T.
