

CHAPTER 523.

AN ACT to authorize, empower and require the County Commissioners of Baltimore County, to appropriate a sum of money to pay the registers of voters of Baltimore County for transcribing the names of the voters from the old registries to the duplicate registries as required by chapter five hundred and seventy-three, of the acts of eighteen hundred and ninety.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the County Commissioners of Baltimore County, be, and they are hereby authorized, empowered and required to appropriate a sum of money sufficient to pay the registers of voters of Baltimore County, the sum of four dollars and fifty cents per diem each, for the actual number of days employed by each of said registers in transcribing the names of voters from the old registries to the duplicate registries as required by chapter five hundred and seventy-three of the acts of eighteen hundred and ninety.

To appropriate.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That the said registers of voters shall each be required by the said County Commissioners of Baltimore County, to present a bill to the said county commissioners, which shall contain the number of days actually employed by the said registers in transcribing the said names as described in the first section of this act, supported by an affidavit or affirmation to be made before some justice of the peace of Baltimore County.

County Commissioners of Baltimore County.

SEC. 3. *And be it enacted,* That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 524.

AN ACT to authorize the County Commissioners of Harford County to grant a pension to "Charles C. Smith."

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the County Commissioners of Harford County be and they are hereby authorized to grant an annual pension of one hundred dollars to Charles C. Smith a citizen of said county.

Pension Charles C. Smith.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage.
