Salary of same. SEC. 747. *And be it enacted,* That each of said matrons shall receive a salary of ten dollars a week, to be paid by the mayor and city council of Baltimore, and it shall be included in the annual estimate of expenses by said board, certified to the mayor and city council of Baltimore.

Effective. SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 537.

AN ACT to add an additional section to article twenty of the Code of Public General Laws, title "Corporations," sub-title "Insurance Department," to be known as section one hundred and forty-three.

Section added SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That an additional section be added to article twenty-five of the Code of Public General Laws, title "Corporations," sub-title "Insurance Department," to be known as section one hundred and forty-three, to read as follows :

Statement of insurance companies. SEC. 143. Every insurance company doing business in any of the counties of this State shall during the month of April of each and every year publish in at least one newspaper published in each of said counties for three consecutive weeks an abstract of the annual statement as required by this article.

Effective. SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage.
