CHAPTER 554.

AN ACT to provide for the speedy execution and enforcement of chapter two hundred and ninety-nine, of the General Assembly of Maryland, passed at January session, eighteen hundred and ninety, relating to the establishing and maintaining a High School in Centreville, Queen Anne's County, Maryland.

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of . CHAPTER 555.

AN ACT to provide for the destruction of the weed or plant known as "The Canada Thistle," on the lands in Queen Anne's County, Maryland, and to prevent the increase thereof.

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That hereafter it shall be unlawful for any person Destruction of persons owning or occupying lands in Queen Anne's tion of County, Maryland, to suffer or permit the weed or plant Thistle. known as "The Canada Thistle "to grow may said land known as "The Canada Thistle," to grow upon said land until it comes to bloom or flowers, but it shall be the duty of every such person or persons to have said weed or plant dug up or cut down before it comes to bloom or flowers and any and all persons violating the provisions of this law shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, punishable on conviction by a fine of not less than five nor more than ten dollars for each and every offence, triable before a justice
