

Misdemeanor. misdemeanor, and on conviction thereof before any justice of the peace in said county shall pay a fine of five dollars for each partridge, woodcock, or rabbit shot or taken; one-half of said fine to be paid to the informer, and the remainder as hereinafter directed, and on failure to pay said fine shall be committed to the county jail or to the house of correction for not longer than ten days, in the discretion of the justice of the peace trying the case.

License to kill game SEC. 3. *And be it further enacted,* That it shall not be lawful for any person not a *bona fide* resident of said county or any corporation to shoot, entrap or in any manner to catch or kill any partridge, woodcock or rabbit in the said county without having first obtained from the clerk of the Circuit Court for said county a license permitting the person named in said license to shoot kill or trap said game in said county during the term when the killing of said game is made lawful by section one of this act, and the person named therein shall pay the said clerk for such license the sum of twenty dollars, which amount shall be turned over to the board of county commissioners by the said clerk and fifty cents to be paid the clerk as his fee for issuing said license, and any non-resident convicted before any justice of the peace in said county for violating the provisions of this section shall be fined twenty dollars for each and every offense, and shall forfeit his gun or guns, ammunition and other apparatus, and on failure to pay said fine the offender shall be confined in the county jail for ten days, and the gun or guns so forfeited shall be sold after giving ten days' notice of time and place of sale by publication in a newspaper published in the county, or by written notice posted at three or more public places in said county at public auction to the highest bidder for cash by the officer the arrest, the proceeds of said sale after deducting five dollars as a fee to the officer for making the sale, to be paid over to the justice of the peace before whom the offender or offenders were tried, and said fine or fines as well as all fines collected by justice of the peace under this act be paid over to the county commissioners.

Who not included. SEC. 4. *And be it further enacted.* That natives of St. Mary's County, who have at any time resided in the said county for a space of fifteen years, or land-owners therein, shall not be included under the provisions of section 111 of this act.

Evidence. SEC. 5. *And be it further enacted,* That the possession by any person within said county of any partridges, quail, woodcock or rabbit without having complied with the necessary requirements of this act to enable him to take or kill
