

SEC. 6. *And be it enacted,* That they shall annually
 Clerk. appoint a clerk, who shall keep the minutes of their proceedings in a well-bound book, which shall be open to inspection of all persons interested therein, and shall perform such other duties as the commissioners may assign him.

SEC. 7. *And be it enacted,* That they shall annually, on
 Judges of election. or before the first Monday in May appoint three judges of election, who shall conduct the election according to the election laws of the State, except that the polls shall be open at two o'clock p. m. and closed at six o'clock p. m. The first election held under the provisions of this act shall be held on the first Monday in May in the year eighteen hundred and ninety-two, and John R. Gibson, Charles R. Murphy and William H. Powis are hereby appointed judges for that purpose.

SEC. 8. *And be it enacted,* That they may annually
 Bailiff. appoint a bailiff for said town, who shall perform such duties as may be required of him by said commissioners and preserve peace and good order in said town; and for that purpose he shall have all the powers of a constable.

SEC. 9. *And be it enacted,* That the commissioners and
 Oath. all other officers of the corporation shall, before they enter upon the duties of their office, make oath that they will diligently and faithfully, to the best of their skill and judgment, perform the duties of their office and shall file a certificate thereof, signed by the officers before whom said oath was made, among the records of the corporation.

SEC. 10. *And be it enacted,* That the commissioners shall
 Returns of elections. receive all returns of election, and determine all questions arising thereon.

SEC. 11. *And be it enacted,* That they may pass such
 Ordinances. ordinances not inconsistent with law, as they may deem beneficial to the town; may open and close streets, lanes, and alleys, grade and pave the same, remove nuisances and obstructions therefrom, restrain all disorders and disturbances, prevent all congregations of disorderly persons in public places, and may impose fines, penalties and forfeitures for the violation of their ordinances, and may commit all offenders to the county jail until the same be paid, with costs.

SEC. 12. *And be it enacted,* That they may as often as
