

CHAPTER 597.

AN ACT to appropriate a sum of money to meet the additional expenses of the Legislature of Maryland, for the session of eighteen hundred and ninety-two.

Appropriation. SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the sum of three thousand dollars or so much thereof as may be necessary, be and the same is hereby appropriated to pay the members and officers of the General Assembly as well as all miscellaneous expenses of said session of eighteen hundred and ninety-two.

Disbursement. SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That the Treasurer of the State shall on the warrant of the comptroller, disburse the said sum of money herein appropriated for the objects and purposes herein specified, to or upon the order of the person or persons entitled to receive the same.

Effective. SEC. 3 *And be it enacted,* That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 598.

AN ACT to repeal section one hundred and eighty-four F, one hundred and eighty-four I, one hundred and eighty-four J, one hundred and eighty-four O, of article two of the Code of Public Local Laws, title "Anne Arundel County," sub-title "Liquor and Intoxicating Drinks" as said section appears in chapter five hundred and sixty-eight of the acts of eighteen hundred and ninety, and to re-enact the same with amendments.

Amendments. SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That section one hundred and and eighty-four F, one hundred and eighty-four I, one hundred and eighty-four J, and one hundred and eighty-four O, of article two of the Code of Public Local Laws, title "Anne Arundel County" sub-title "Liquor and Intoxicating Drinks," as the said section appears in chapter five hundred and sixty-eight of the acts of eighteen hundred and ninety, be and the same are hereby repealed and re-enacted with amendments so as to read as follows :
