

eighteen hundred and ninety, be and the same is hereby repealed and re-enacted with amendment so as to read as follows :

155. It shall not be lawful for any person in the fish spawning season, that is to say, between the first day of March, and the first day of May in any year, to put, place, erect, construct or use in waters of Severn River, at any point above Bulling's Cove on the one side and Poplar Spring on the other side of said river, or in the waters of South River, or in any of the creeks, coves, or tributaries of the Severn River, or South River, above points where any creek, cove or tributary is in channel of a less depth than three feet, or anywhere in Severn Run of Severn River, and set-net, fish-basket, fish-pot, fish-trap, set-line, weir, pound net-fyke, seine or drag-net, or any other instrument or contrivance whatsoever, now known or used in the catching or destroying of fish, or which may hereafter be invented for that purpose, or to take, catch, capture or destroy any fish from, by or with the same, or any of the same, except with hook and line.

Effective. SEC. 2. *And be it enacted*, That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 605.

AN ACT to appropriate a sum of money to pay to the Treasurer of the State Board of Education the amount of sundry bills paid by him for repairs to the State Normal School building.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That the Comptroller of the Treasury be and he is hereby authorized and directed to issue his warrant upon the Treasurer of Maryland to pay to the treasurer of the State Board of Education the sum of two thousand two hundred and twenty-three dollars and eighty-eight cents, being the amount of sundry bills paid by him under the direction of the State Board of Education for material furnished and work done on the State Normal School building in the years eighteen hundred and ninety and eighteen hundred and ninety-one to the following persons and firms, viz: To Keilholtz & Crisp the sum of fifty dollars and eighty-six cents, to Miller D. Melter & Son the sum of forty-two dollars and sixty-six cents, to C. I. Stewart & Sons the sum of
