The jurisdiction of justices of the peace extends Jurisdic to cases where administrations are parties plaintiffs or tion where defendants except that no administrator shall be sued before trators are a justice within twelve months from the date of his letters: "provided, that in the city of Baltimore the said suits may be brought within three months from the date of such letters."

SEC. 2. And be it further enacted, That this act shall take Effective effect from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 620.

AN ACT to appropriate a sum of money to pay Frank T. Gibson and B. T. Highley for publishing the constitutional amendments and Governor's proclamation in accordance with authority from the Governor of the State of Maryland.

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland. That the Comptroller of the State be and he is priations, hereby authorized and directed to issue his warrant upon the treasurer of the State for one hundred and twenty dollars in favor of Frank T. Gibson, editor and proprietor of the Comet and Advertiser, a weekly newspaper printed and published at St. Michael's, and one hundred and twenty dollars for Burton T. Highley, publisher of the Talbot Times, in Talbot County, for publishing the constitutional amendments and Governor's proclamation according to authority given by the Governor of the State of Maryland.

SEC. 2. And he it enacted. That this act shall take effect Effective. from the date of its passage.
