

any prisoner or prisoners prove refractory and stubborn, and refuse to work or to perform the work in a proper manner, the sheriff shall place such prisoner or prisoners in close confinement, solitary if possible, within the jail, there to be kept on bread and water until he or they submit to perform his or their work properly, and obey orders from the authority under whose supervision he or they must work. The time of refusal to work shall not be deducted from the sentence of any person or persons who shall so refuse.

SEC. 5. *And be it enacted*, That all beggars and vagabonds who roam about from place to place, without any lawful business or occupation, sleeping in outhouses, barns, sheds, or in the open air, and not giving a good account of themselves, shall be deemed vagrants and liable to the penalties of this act.

SEC. 6. *And be it enacted*, That the sheriff of Carroll County shall report to the mayor and common council of Westminster, or to the officer of the city of Westminster under whose supervision the hard labor provided for in this act is to be performed, immediately upon their reception into jail, the name of all prisoners sentenced to hard labor and the length of sentence of each. The said sheriff of Carroll County shall deliver to the officer of Westminster under whose supervision the hard labor contemplated by this act is to be done, upon his request, all prisoners in his custody under sentence at hard labor, and receive them upon their return by said officer of Westminster, and for this delivery and reception the sheriff shall be entitled to a fee of twenty-five cents for each delivery and twenty-five cents for each reception of said prisoners each and every day, said fees to be paid by the County Commissioners of Carroll County; and the sheriff shall retain custody and control of said prisoners while at labor, and shall see that the work to be done by them is performed according to the requirements of the said mayor and common council, or their authorized officer; and for such custody and control of said prisoners and supervision of the work done by them, the sheriff shall be allowed the sum of two dollars and fifty cents per day for the first five of said prisoners or any smaller number thereof, and the sum of twenty-five cents per day for each prisoner additional to the first five so put at labor, during the continuance of said labor.

SEC. 7. *And be it enacted*, That the officer of the city of Westminster, under whose direction and supervision the hard labor contemplated by this act is to be performed, shall make monthly report to the County Commissioners of
