nesses, bailiffs and crier hereafter attending the Circuit Court for said county, and in the second place for work hereafter to be done upon the public roads, and in the third place, in the settlement of all other county indebtedness in the order in which the county commissioners in their decision may determine to settle.

Statement of claims paid.

SEC. 7. And be it enacted, That the said county commissioners shall have published annually in two newspapers published in said county in addition to the levy list of said county hereafter to be made a statement, showing all claims, certificates and accounts paid by such board of county commissioners under the provisions of this act which claims, certificates, and accounts shall not be included in the annual levy list published in said county.

Repeal. SEC. 8. And be it enacted, That all laws or part of laws, inconsistent with this act are hereby repealed.

SEC. 9. And be it enacted, That this act shall take effect Effective. from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 626.

AN ACT to add a new section to article thirty-three of the Code of Public General Laws, title "Election," to be known as section one hundred and thirty-one A.

New section. SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the following section numbered as one hundred and thirty-one A, be and the same is hereby added to article thirty-three of the Code of Public General Laws, to come in after section one hundred and thirty-one and before section one hundred and thirty-two.

Independent nominstion papers.

131 A. As soon as practicable after the expiration of the time during which nomination papers for the nomination of independent candidates are required to be kept on file in the office of the board of supervisors of elections of Baltimore City it shall be the duty of the said board of supervisors to certify under their hands, to the Secretary of State the name and address of each person proposed, in any of said nomination papers as a candidate for the representative in Congress or for any office to be voted for by the voters of the whole State, or by the voters of the whole or any part of the city of Baltimore together with the voters of any other portion of the State and the number of registered voters signing each of the said nomination papers.
