CHAPTER 651.

AN ACT to repeal, amend and re-enact section 614 of article 4 of the Code of Public Local Laws, title "City of Baltimore," sub-title "Justices of the Peace and Constables," as amended by chapter 230 of the acts passed at the January session of 1890, and to add an additional section thereto to be known as 614 A.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That section 614 of article 4 of the Code of Public Local Laws, title "City of Baltimore," sub-title "Justices of the Peace and Constables," as amended by chapter 230 of the acts passed at the January session of 1890, be and the same is hereby repealed, amended and re enacted, and an additional section to be known as 614 A is added thereto so as to read as follows :

614 A. That where there is an arrest by an officer of the police department in the city of Baltimore of any person for violation of an ordinance of the mayor and city council of Baltimore or a statute of the General Assembly of the State of Maryland punishable by fine and not by imprisonment, during the hours when the police magistrates are not at their respective station houses, the police captain, lieutenant or other officer on duty and in charge of such station is hereby authorized and empowered to release for the next hearing before the police magistrate any person so arrested upon a deposit of an amount equal to the fine or costs or penalty imposed if found guilty as surety for such appearance, and after the hearing the deposit is to be returned to the depositor if the complaint is dismissed, if otherwise it is to be appropriated as designated by law.
