Baltimore City; provided the said Wyatt Owens first obtain permission of the mayor and city council of Baltimore City to make connection with said Light Street Bridge.

SEC. 2. And be it enacted, That said bridge shall be built How to be in a substantial manner, not less than eighteen feet in bulk, width and having a critical and width, and having a suitable draw for the passage of vessels, provided, the engineer of the harbor board of Baltimore City deems a draw in said necessary.

SEC. 3. And be it enacted, That Baltimore City or Balti-Right to purchase, more County shall have the right and privilege at any time to purchase said bridge for the purpose of making it a free public highway.

SEC. 4. And be it enacted, That this act shall take effect Effective. from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 678.

AN ACT to repeal and re-enact with amendments section one hundred and sixty of article seven of the Code of Public General Laws, title "Crimes and Punishments."

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That section one hundred and sixty of article Amendtwenty-seven of the Code of Public General Laws, title ment. "Crimes and Punishments," be repealed and re enacted so as to read as follows:

SEC. 160. The taking and carrying away by any person of corn from the stalk of the quantity of a peck or more, or the taking and carrying away willows from the stump of meanor, the weight of five pounds or more, or the taking and carrying away of melons from the vine, fruits from the trees or roots and vegetables from the soil, with a malicious intent to convert the same to his own use shall be deemed a misdemeanor, and any person guilty of the same shall upon conviction be fined not more than fifty dollars, or be sentenced to imprisonment in the House of Correction for not more than twelve months or be both fined and imprisoned in the discretion of the court.
