

(or affirm) that I will true answers make to all questions necessary to ascertain my qualifications or disqualifications, under the constitution to be registered as a qualified voter; but nothing in the oath or affirmation contained shall be construed to authorize the register to ask any questions touching any cause of disqualifications not expressly enumerated in the Constitution of Maryland, or of the United States; and no person shall be permitted to register who is disqualified under any of the provisions of the Constitution of Maryland, except in relation to color; and the registers of voters so appointed as aforesaid shall have the same qualifications and shall perform their duties in their several aldermanic districts as are now required of the registers for the ten wards of the city, except that the publication of the list of voters shall be made by hand-bills distributed in their respective districts, instead of by printing in the newspapers as heretofore directed.

SEC. 163. The register of the City of Frederick shall have a book of registration prepared for the officers of registration for each of said wards, and the said books shall be so ruled or printed as to enable him to designate by the street, lane or alley or other local description, the residence of every person who shall register and be entitled to vote in the said ward for Mayor, Aldermen, or for any other purpose at any election held by or under the municipal authority of Frederick City; and after advertisement inserted once a week for two weeks in at least one newspaper published in Frederick City, and by hand-bills or such other notice as he may deem proper, of his intention so to do, he shall proceed at some convenient place in his ward, to be designated in his said advertisement, at the hour of nine o'clock in the morning, on first Wednesday in May, and tri-annually thereafter to open said book of registration, and the same kept open until five o'clock in the afternoon of said day for the purpose of registering all the qualified voters of his said ward who shall be entitled under the provisions of this sub-title of this article to be registered and to vote at any municipal election held thereunder and who shall apply for registration; and he shall cause said list to be published in one newspaper, published in Frederick City, and also by hand-bills posted in such public places in his ward as he may select.

And no voter who has been once registered shall be entitled to be registered in another aldermanic district, until he has produced a certificate from the register certifying that he has been stricken from the books of the aldermanic district in which he was formerly registered.
