to serve from September first to April first as before stated, provided however, that the owners of such boats so hired shall keep the same in good order and repair.

SEC. 4. Be it enacted, That the sum of fifteen thousand dollars be and the same is hereby appropriated out of the funds standing to the credit of the oyster fund, or so much priation. thereof as may be necessary, for the purpose of building and equipping the three sailing vessels herein first provided for, and the comptroller is hereby authorized to draw his warrant on the treasurer for the same upon the order of the said Board of Public Works.

SEC. 5. Be it enacted, That this act shall take effect from Effective. the date of its passage.

AN ACT to give the assent of the General Assembly of Maryland to the sale by the vestry of Saint Stephen's Church of Baltimore to the trustees of the Anshe Emunah Hebrew Congregation of Baltimore City, of all that lot of ground with the improvements thereon situate at the corner of Hanover street and Welcome alley in the city of Baltimore, and more particularly described in a lease from John Eager Howard to the vestry of Saint Stephen's Church of Baltimore, dated the ninth day of May 1857 and recorded among the land records of Baltimore City in Liber E. D., No. 127, folio 176.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the assent of the General Assembly of Maryland be and the same is hereby given to the sale by the a sale. vestry of Saint Stephen's Church of Baltimore to the trustees of the Anshe Emunah Hebrew Congregation of Baltimore City, ot all that lot of ground with improvements thereon situate at the corner of Hanover street and welcome alley in the city of Baltimore, and more particularly described in a lease from John Eager Howard to the vestry of Saint Stephen's Church of Baltimore, dated the ninth day of May, 1857, and recorded among the land records of Baltimore City in Liber E. D., No. 127, folio 176.

SEC. 2. And be it enacted, That this act shall take effect Effective. from the date of its passage.
