To the acquisition, holding and disposing of a certain leasehold tract of land on the west side of William street in Baltimore City, by the South Baltimore Free Methodist Society of Baltimore City, which is described in a lease from George Rose and wife to the said South Baltimore Free Methodist Society of Baltimore City, dated the 30th day of December in the year 1875, and recorded among the land records of Baltimore City in Liber G. B., No. 731, folio 272, &c.

5. To the sale and grant by Nicholas M. Smith to the trustees of the Anshe Sphard Hebrew Congregation of Baltimore City, of all his, the said Smith's rights, title, interests and estate in and to all that lot of ground with the improvements thereon, situate in the city of Baltimore, on the westernmost side of High street, and more particularly described in an assignment from said Nicholas M. Smith to the said trustees of the Anshe Sphard Hebrew Congregation of Baltimore City, dated the second day of February, 1891, and recorded among the land records of Baltimore City in Liber J. 6. To the devises and bequests contained in the last will and testament of Annie M.
