thousand dollars, said will being dated January 7th, 1878; second, to the bequest of said Mary E. Fislage under said will to the St. Joseph's German Hospital of the city of Baltimore, a body corporate, of the State of Maryland, of the sum of five hundred dollars; third, to the bequest of said Mary E. Fislage under said will, to the Little Sisters of the Poor, a body corporate, of the State of Maryland, of the sum of three hundred dollars.

41. To a deed of conveyance from John T. Norris to the trustees of the Otterbain's Chapel of the Church of the Togrant United Brethren in Christ in the city of Baltimore dated Norris. December 22nd, 1885, recorded among the land records of Baltimore City, in Liber J. B., No. 1079, folio 279, &c., and to the grant therein contained and set forth.

SEC. 2. And be it enacted, That this act shall take effect Effective. from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 696.

AN ACT to establish a free bridge over the Patuxent River at or near the present site at Hill's bridge and to provide for free travel from Anne Arundel to Prince George's County.

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the County Commissioners of Anne Arundel County and the County Commissioners of Prince George's Authority County, be and they are hereby authorized, empowered and directed to purchase the bridge over the Patuxent River known as Hill's bridge, together with the abutments and all other appurtenances thereto belonging or appertaining, and to keep and maintain the same as a free bridge at all times, if the owners thereof, will on or before the first day of October, eighteen hundred and ninety-two, agree to sell the same unto the said County Commissioners of Anne Arundel County and the County Commissioners of Prince George's County at a price not to exceed the sum of five thousand dollars.

SEC. 2. And be it enacted, That if the County Commissioners of Anne Arundel County and the County Commissioners of Prince George's County shall not be able, by bridge mutual agreement to purchase said Hills' bridge from its owners, as provided in the preceding section of this act then and in that case, the said County Commissioners of
