Leave was granted to the Committee on Inspections to introduce a bill entitled an Act to repeal and reenact with amendments, section twelve, of Article 4S, of the Code of Public General Laws, title "Inspections," sub title "Tobacco," as the same was repealed and re-enacted by chapter 262, of the Acts of 1890, and to add an additional section to said Article, under said sub-title, to be known as "Section 12 A," providing for the storage of goods, wares and merchandize in the unused tobacco warehouses.
