JOINT RESOLUTION,

Be it resolved by the House of Delegates, That the president or chief officer of every savings bank in this State, and every incorporated institution in this State which receives deposits and compounds the interest and dividends thereon as they become due, shall make a report in writing to the Comptroller, on or before the first day of July, 1892, of all deposits made in such savings bank or institution of more than three years standing, and unclaimed for and unclaimed.

Endorsed: "Reported unfavorably from the Committee on Finance, and report adopted."
