Said bill was then returned to the Senate.

House bill entitled an Act to repeal section 124, of Article 81, of the Code of Public General Laws, Volume II, and to re-enact the same with amendments.

Mr. Wooters moved (seconded by Messrs. Gallagher and Collins) that the vote by which said bill failed for want of a Constitutional majority be reconsidered.

Which motion prevailed, and said bill was placed on third reading file.

House bill entitled an Act for the relief of the Hagerstown Seminary, and to appropriate money for the same and provide for the education and board of three scholars from each of the following counties: Garrett, Allegany, Washington, Frederick and Montgomery.
