

"Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That from and after the passage of this Act no corporation which, under the laws of this State, shall act as surety on any bond, shall act as trustee, executor, administrator, guardian, committee or receiver, or in any one or more of those capacities, without bond or security other than its own obligation in any case where bond is required from a natural person; and all Acts and parts of Acts, whether general or special, inconsistent herewith, be and the same are hereby repealed."

Mr. Carter demanded the yeas and nays.
