Senate bill entitled an Act to authorize and require the County Commissioners of Somerset county to have placed and keep on the several lines, to which it may be lawful to use scoops, scrapes and dredges, or any similar instrument to take or catch oysters in the waters of the Annamessex, Monokin and Wicomico rivers, in said county, such buoys or other marks as may be necessary to plainly designate said lines and to levy upon the assessable property of Somerset county such sum or sums not exceeding one hundred and fifty dollars, as may be necessary for this purpose.
