Moore and Otto Sutro, for work and labor done, material furnished and services rendered to the Leonard Calvert Monument Committee.

Senate bill entitled an Act to pay John Murphy & Company a sum of money for supplies furnished by them to State Tobacco Warehouse No. 2.

Also, unfavorably,

Senate bill entitled an Act to authorize and empower Mary E. Metz, of Baltimore county, to bring suit against the State of Maryland for damages sustained by loss of business by reason of the erection of the Maryland Hospital for the Insane, on property adjacent to hers.
