

Senate bill entitled an Act to repeal the Act passed at the January Session 1878, chapter 343, as codified in the Code of Public General Laws, Article 27, title "Crimes and Punishments," sub-title "House of Refuge," section 353, and to re-enact the same with amendments.

Was read a third time, and passed by yeas and nays, as follows:
