The Secretary of the Senate appeared and delivered the following message:

House bill entitled an Act to repeal and re-enact with amendments new section 32, of Article 33, of the Code of Public General Laws of Maryland title "Elections," sub-title "Registration," as enacted by the Act of 1890, chapter 573.

Endorsed: "Reported unfavorably from the Committee on Elections and report adopted."
